Color Keys

(red) Types MAX to find MAX maximum statistics.

(green) Types MIN to find MIN minimum statistics

(yellow) Types a Greater Than GT/LT (GT) or Less Than (LT) limiter in a request.

(blue) Switches between BAT/PIT batting and pitching statistics.

Direction Keys



Moves in indicated direction.

Understanding the Color Keys

The color keys (red, green, yellow, and blue) perform the functions listed above only for the BOOKMAN book described in this User's Guide.

Other books have their own color key functions, which are labelled on their book cards and listed in their User's Guides. For more information, read "Using the Color Keys."

Installing a Book Card

Warning: Never install or remove a book card when your BOOKMAN is turned on. If you do, information that you entered in its built-in book, as well as in any other installed book card may be erased.

- 1. Turn your BOOKMAN off.
- 2. Turn your BOOKMAN over.
- 3. Align the tabs of the book card with the notches in the slot.



4. Press the book card down until it snaps into place.

> Removing Book Cards

Warning: When you remove a book card to install another, information that you entered in the removed book card may be erased.

Selecting a Book

Once you have installed a book card in your BOOKMAN, you can select which book you want to use.

- 1. Turn your BOOKMAN on.
- 2. Press CARD.





These are sample books.

3. Press ⟨¬ or ¬⟩ to highlight the book you want to use.





4. Press (ENTER) to select it.

> Auto Shutoff and Auto Resume


If you forget to turn off your BOOK-MAN, it will automatically shut off in two minutes.

Also, you can turn off your BOOK-MAN at any screen. When you turn your BOOKMAN on again, the screen that you last viewed appears.

Using the Color Keys

The red, green, yellow, and blue keys on the top row of your BOOKMAN change their functions according to which book you have selected.

If you have selected the built-in book, the color keys function as labeled on the BOOKMAN keyboard. If you have selected a book card, the color keys function as labeled on that card.



Remember, when you have selected a book card, the color keys function as labeled on that card, not as on the keyboard.

Viewing a Demonstration

Before you start using this book, you may want to view a demonstration of what it can do.

Once you have installed the book card and selected this book, type *DEMO* and press (ENTER) to view the demonstration. If you want to stop the demonstration, press (CLEAR).

> Changing the Contrast

You can change the screen contrast by pressing \bigcirc and then repeatedly pressing \bigcirc or \bigcirc .

➤ Help is Always at Hand

You can view a help message at any screen by pressing (HELP). Use the direction keys or press (SPACE) to read the help text. Then press (BACK) to exit the message.

To read a tutorial about this book, press (HELP) at the Request screen. Use the Direction keys to move the pointer to a topic and then press (ENTER). Use the direction keys or press (SPACE) to read the help message. Then press (BACK) to exit.

Finding Player Statistics

You can find a player's pitching and batting statistics by entering the player's name. If a player is primarily a pitcher then his pitching statistics will be displayed first, or if a player is primarily a batter, then his batting statistics will be displayed first.

- 1. Press CLEAR).
- 2. Type a player's name.

To erase letters, press (BACK) or (7.

3. Press ENTER to view his full name and career totals.

To find a pitcher's batting statistics, or a batter's pitching statistics, if any, press (RAT/PI) (the blue key).

6. To zoom directly to the bottom of the statistics, hold

(CAP) and then press J.

You can also zoom in any direction by holding CAP and then pressing the appropriate arrow key.

- 7. To find statistics for the player's team, press (ENIER) when the desired year is marked.
- 8. Press (CLEAR) when finished.

> Just Follow the Arrows

The flashing arrows on the right of the screen show which arrow keys you can press to move around the screen.

Finding Player Statistics

More About Entering Names

You can enter players by their first and last name, last and first name, last name alone, or even by first name or nickname alone (e.g. MEL OTT, OTT MEL, OTT, or MED. Note: By entering only a player's first or last name, the encyclopedia will find all of the players who share that name.

➤ Correcting Players' Names

If you misspell a player's name, or type a name that is ambiguous or unclear, don't worry. This encyclopedia automatically provides a list of corrections. Use the arrow keys to move the pointer to the desired player, and then press (ENTER) to select that player. For example, type RODRIGUEZ and press (ENTER). All of the players who have shared the name Rodriguez are listed.


➤ Typing Numbers

To type numbers, hold and press the numbered keys. To lock the numbered keys, hold and press N. To unlock the numbered keys, hold and press N again.

Finding Rookies

Every player in this encyclopedia is listed alphabetically by the year he began playing major league baseball. Here is how to find all of the rookies for a given year.

- 1. Type the desired year. For example, type 1954.
- 2. Press ENTER).



- Use the arrow keys to view player's statistics.
- 4. Hold and press to view the next rookie listed alphabetically.

 To view a previous rookie, hold and press .
- 5. Press (CLEAR) when finished.


➤ More About Finding Rookies

In addition, while viewing any player's statistics you can view statistics of other players who were rookies the same year, by holding and pressing for W. For example, you can look up a player (e.g., Nolan Ryan) and discover which players began their career during the same year.

Finding Team Statistics

To find a team's batting and pitching statistics for a certain year, enter a team and a year. A team can be a team's name (e.g., CUBS), city (e.g., CHICAGO), or city abbreviation (e.g., CHI). If you don't enter a year, you will see statistics for the first year of a team's operation.

1. At the Request screen, type a team name and a year.



To type the year, hold \(\) and use the numbered keys.

2. Press ENTER).


> About the Screen Illustrations

Some screen illustrations in this User's Guide may differ from what you view on screen. This does not mean that your BOOKMAN or this book card is malfunctioning.

Correcting Team Names

If you enter a city or team name that is ambiguous or unclear, this encyclopedia will give you a list of teams from which to choose.

1. Type BRAVES and press ENTER.



A list of team choices appears.

- 2. Use the arrow keys to mark 1966-96 ATL BRAVES.
- 3. Press ENTER to view team statistics.

➤ Misspelling Team Names


If you misspell a team or city name (e.g., YANKIES), you will view a list of players whose names are close to what you entered (e.g., HUGH YANCY, GEORGE YANKOWSKI, and YANK TERRY)

Finding League Standings

League standings include number of wins and losses, won/loss percentage (PCT), and games behind first place (GB).

Eastern Division records are shown first, the Central Division second, and the Western Division last, when applicable.

1. Type NL or AL and a year.



Type a space between the league and a year. To type the year hold the key and press the number keys.

- 2. Press (ENTER).
- 3. Press **!** repeatedly to view the standings.

Finding League Standings

- 5. Press (ENTER) to view a marked team's statistics for that year.
- 6. Press CLEAR when finished.

> More About Standings

You can find team's won/loss records and winning percentages over several seasons by entering their league and a year range. For example, enter *NL* 1990-1995.

Finding World Series and Award Winners

You can find awards and achievements with this encyclopedia. Note: You will not be able to find a listing for the 1994 World Series due to the 1994 baseball strike.

 Type one of the following requests (e.g., AW 1993):

To View... Type...

World Series Results All Award Winners Hall of Fame Players WS + year AW + year HOF


- Press J to move down the list. Note: The next step does not apply to the Hall of Fame player list.
- 5. Press (ENIER) to view a marked player's statistics.
- 6. Press **CLEAR** when finished.

Finding Bests and Worsts

You can find a list of up to 50 of the best or worst players for a specific statistic by using the MAX and MIN keys followed by a stat abbreviation.

Note: A list of all of the stat abbreviations that can be used in a request can be found in "Appendix B Abbreviations."


1. Press (MAX) (the red key) and then type a stat abbreviation.



The space after MAX is typed automatically.

You can also type the word MAX.

2. Press (ENTER).



3. Press . to view the players in the list.

To go to the bottom of the list, hold CAP and press **J**.

Finding Bests and Worsts

- Use the arrow keys to move the pointer to a desired player.
- 6. Press (ENTER) to view his career statistics.
- 7. Press (CLEAR) when finished.

> Biographical Information


You can request player lists using biographical stat abbreviations: HT for Height, WT for Weight, and AGE for Age. For example, enter MAX WT to view baseball's heavyweights.

Using Ratios

A ratio is one stat abbreviation divided by another. You can type a ratio rather than a single stat abbreviation after MAX or MIN in your requests.

However.

- you can't divide a batting stat abbreviation by a pitching stat abbreviation or vice versa (e.g. AB/IP), and
- you can't use stat abbreviations in ratios that are already ratios (i.e., BA, ERA, SLG).
- 1. Press (red) and then type a ratio.



To type a /, hold (☆) and press ⟨⇒.

2. Press ENTER).



3. Use the arrow keys to view the players and their ratios.

Using Ratios

- 4. To view a player's career statistics, press (ENTER) when his name is marked.
- 5. Press (CLEAR) when finished.

> About Infinite Ratios

The value of a ratio is infinite when its denominator is zero. For example, if you enter MAX W/L, then press

→ to view the statistics, you'll see this:



INF (infinite) means that Ben Shields and others never lost a game.

➤ Using Ratios Realistically

When you type requests with ratios, you'll often want to limit the denominator to view players with significant at-bats, innings pitched, and so on.

Read "Adding a Limiter" to learn how.

Adding a Limiter

To limit the statistical range of your requests, type a limiter following MAX or MIN and the stat abbreviation or ratio. A limiter searches for statistics that are greater than or less than a particular number. Requests with limiters always have this structure:

MAX or MIN + a stat abbreviation or ratio + a stat abbreviation + GT or LT + a number

In this example, we'll find the players with the most home runs (MAX HR) who had less than 150 at bats (AB LT 150).

1. Press (max) (red) or (ms) (the green key), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and then type a limiter.

```
TYPE YOUR REQUEST....
MAX HR AB LT 150 ....
...THEN PRESS ENTER
```

You can either type GT or LT or press (at/Lt) (the yellow key). To get GT press the key once; to get LT press the key twice.

- 2. Press (ENTER).
- Use the arrow keys to view the list.

Adding a Limiter

> Understanding Limiters

Each limiter must be preceded by its own stat abbreviation, even when that stat abbreviation or ratio is the same as the one following MAX or MIN. For example, to view the players with the most home runs who have at least 500 home runs, you would need to enter MAX HR HR GT 499. Notice the second HR.

When you're limiting a ratio, you'll usually want to limit the denominator. For example, to view the players with the best home-runs-to-at-bats ratio who have at least 1,000 career at-bats, you would enter MAX HR/AB AB GT 1000

➤ Limiting Biographical Statistics

Type weight in pounds, height in inches (e.g., 67 for players who are 5'7"), and age in years.

In a given season, each player's age is determined by how old that player is on July 1. So a player who is 24 years old on June 30, is considered 24 years old for the entire season.

Adding Qualifiers

You can also limit a request with one or more qualifiers. Qualifiers limit an entry to a specific quality (e.g., a team or a year.)

► Team Qualifiers

To narrow your lists to a single team, add a team qualifier to your requests.

You can type only one team qualifier in a request. If you enter a team that has had more than one home city, or if you enter a city which has more than one team, you'll see a list of team choices first.

 Press (MX) (red) or (MN) (green), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and then type a team qualifier.

Adding Qualifiers

Year Oualifiers

You can use year qualifiers to limit your request to a specific time frame. Here are some examples.

1. Press (red) or (green), type a stat abbreviation or ratio, and type a year qualifier.

- 3. Use the arrow keys to view more statistics.
- 4. Press (CLEAR) when finished.

To find highly specific lists, add a limiter and some qualifiers to your requests. You can add a limiter, a team qualifier, and as many other qualifiers as make sense, up to 48 characters. Your qualifiers can be in any order.

Advanced requests often will produce a list of fewer than 50 players. In this example, we'll find pitchers with the lowest earned run averages (MIN ERA), who pitched more than 500 innings (IP GT 500), played for the Cubs (CUBS), played from 1980 through 1989 (80-89), and threw right-handed (TR).

1. Type the following request: MIN ERA IP GT 500 CUBS 80-89 TR.

TYPE YOUR REQUEST...
MIN ERA IP GT SOC CUBS _.
...THEN PRESS ENTER

TYPE YOUR REQUEST...

IP GT 500 CUBS 80-89 TR..

...THEN PRESS ENTER

2. Press (ENTER).

- 3. Use arrow keys to view players and statistics.
- 4. Press ENTER to view a player's career statistics.
- 5. Press CLEAR when finished.

➤ Bad Requests

If you see the "Bad Request" message, check the following:

- that you typed correct stat abbreviations.
 that your ratio doesn't mix batting.
- that your ratio doesn't mix batting and pitching stat abbreviations or contain another ratio (e.g., ERA, SLG, etc.).
- that your request contains no more than one limiter.

➤ Sample Advanced Requests

- MIN BA HR GT 30 SS
- MAX SO ERA GT 4.5
- MAX W/L IP GT 2000 NL
- MAX HR WT LT 151 SS

Resetting BOOKMAN

If the BOOKMAN keyboard fails to respond, or if its screen performs erratically, first press (CLEAR) and then press (CNOFF) twice. If nothing happens, follow the steps below to reset it.

Warning: Pressing the reset button with more than very light pressure may permanently disable your BOOKMAN. In addition, resetting BOOKMAN erases settings and information entered into its built-in book, and in an installed book card.

- **1. Hold** CLEAR and press ON/OFF. If nothing happens, try Step 2.
- 2. Use a paper clip to gently press BOOKMAN's reset button.

To learn where the reset button is located on your BOOKMAN, read its User's Guide.

This unit may change operating modes due to Electro-static Discharge. Normal operation of this unit can be re-established by pressing the reset key, (NOTE), or by removing/replacing batteries.
